Any BPM course in which a grade of C or lower is earned must be re-taken, and a final grade of C or better must be earned. Graduates of this program are prepared for admissions to the Masters of Public Administration program. Statistics is a pre-requisite for the MPA program)

PROGRAM OF STUDY AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Complete the AA degree at the community college. Some courses required for the major may also meet the General Education Requirements thereby transferring maximum hours to the university.

If you transfer without an AA degree and have less than 60 semester hours of acceptable credit you must meet the university's entering freshman requirements including ACT or SAT test scores and GPA.

Students must complete the following required common prerequisites during the program of study at the community college:

- (P) American National Government (POS x041) 3
- (P) Macroeconomics (ECO x013) 3
- (P) Intro to Computing or Computer Science (CGSx060) 3
- (S) Introductory Statistics (STAxxxx)** 3

(P)=Students may be admitted to FAU upper division without having completed this course, however the course must be completed before graduation and may cause excess hours.

(S)=It is suggested that the student take this course at the community college. If not, the student can complete this course as part of the upper division program at the university. *(Statistics is required for the MPA degree-not for completion of BPM)
