PROGRAM OF STUDY AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Complete the A. A. degree at the community college. Some courses required for the major may also meet the General Education Requirements, thereby transferring maximum hours to the university.

If you transfer without an A. A. degree and have less than 60 semester hours of acceptable credit, you must meet the university’s entering freshmen requirements, including ACT or SAT test scores and GPA.
