The Wilkes Honors College's intellectual foundation is a belief that a liberal arts education is the best preparation for a productive life. Classes are small and students are active participants in the design of their education. The curriculum is comprised of the Honors College Interdisciplinary Core and the Concentration. Students develop a personal writing portfolio, participate in an off-campus learning experience such as an internship or study abroad, and complete a senior thesis.

PROGRAM OF STUDY AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Complete the A.A. degree at the community college.

Students are encouraged to complete the following required prerequisites during the program of study at the community college:

(S)= It is suggested that the student take this course at the community college. If not, the student can complete this course as part of the upper-division program at the University.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO THE HONORS COLLEGE PROGRAM OF STUDY

Please be aware of the immunization, foreign language, and continuous enrollment policies of the university. Although transfer students are not required to submit high school transcripts and test scores, students are required to do so when they submit the SUS Application and the Honors College Supplementary Application materials. The later consists of 2 letters of evaluation, a graded writing sample and resume. Details are available on the website. Most successful transfer applicants will have a Grade Point Average of 3.5.

SCHOLARSHIPS Merit scholarships are awarded to transfer students upon admission to the Honors College. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$7,500 a year, and are renewable for the senior year.

RESIDENTIAL LIVING REQUIREMENT

On-campus living strengthens the Honors College community and is required for unmarried students under 26 years of age.

In addition to obtaining a breadth of knowledge in the liberal arts and sciences through general education courses taken at the community college, each student chooses a concentration.
