PROGRAM OF STUDY AT COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Complete the A.A. degree at community college. Several General Education requirements may also meet course requirements for the major. A transfer student without an A.A. degree and with less than 60 acceptable credits must meet entering freshman test score and GPA requirements.

Students are encouraged to complete the lower-division courses during the program of study at community college. No more than 6 lower-division credits will be accepted. If complete with a grade of "C" or greater, the courses will count towards the American/British Literature category.
