Students can earn proficiency by successfully completing a second level course. For questions related to this requirement, consult an academic advisor. CLEP exam credits meet this requirement: see catalog. **NOTE: Native speakers of a foreign language must consult the Lang & Ling dept regarding this requirement.**

The Department of Criminal Justice has the following requirements: (1) 45 credit minimum of upper division course work, (2), no more than 42 credits in the major (CCJ, CJC, CJE, CJL courses) to be counted towards a degree, (3) a minimum of 'C' is required for each CCJ, CJC, CJE, CJL or DSC prefixed course work (a grade below 'C', such as 'C-', will not count toward any portion of the required 120 credits).

Students who come with less than 60 credit hours must complete 9 credit hours of summer course work either at FAU or another SUS institution.
