Sweden's capital city, Stockholm, is a walking city situated on 14 islands that are connected by bridges. In every way Stockholm is an international city with residents from all over the globe. It is a lively and energetic city with lovely beaches, fascinating landscapes, magnificent buildings and modern architecture. This über cool city blends the old and new giving it a vibrant culture filled with trendy inhabitants. Stockholm University is one of the oldest in Sweden and possesses an outstanding reputation. The main campus stretches across a naturally inspiring landscape - in and around the world's first National City Park. Courses: Students only can select courses offered by Stockholm University School of Business. For a list of business courses offered in English, please visit http://www2.fek.su.se/index_student.html. Students must meet the pre-requisites for the courses offered and are expected to take four courses each semester, totaling 12 credit hours. The Swedish academic year consists of two semesters, autumn and spring, each 20 weeks long. Each semester is divided into four periods, comprising five weeks. Students take one course at a time and do so for five weeks.

Below are the periods for the Fall 2009 and Spring 2010 semesters:

Period 1	August 24 –September 25	January 18 – February 19
Period 2	September 28 –October 30	February 20 – March 26
Period 3	November 2 – December 5	March 29 – April 30
Period 4	December 7 –January 15	May 3 – June 4

Eligibility: 2.500 GPA

Estimated Costs: Airfare, FAU tuition (out-of-state tuition extra), rent/housing per month est. SEK 3,500 (www.fek.su.se/en/Education/General-information/Housing), meals est. SEK 2,000, local transportation card per month SEK 690, membership in Student Union SEK 500, books, meals, \$100 FAU application fee/basic insurance/ISIC card, and spending money. Exchange rates fluctuate daily, visit www.oanda.com for the latest exchange rate.

Deadlines for Applying: Fall semester/ Full year: April 15, 2009; Spring semester: September 15, 2009. FAU students must be nominated by the Office of International Programs to participate in the program.
