**Course Description:** The Florida Atlantic University Pep Band is designed to promote the advancement of the University through entertainment, artistic performance, and school spirit while enhancing the collegiate, life-building experience of the membership. Class may be repeated.

## Purpose:

The purpose of the 'Parliament Sound' Pep Band is to provide entertaining performances that draw the audience into the game, inspire the team to victory, represent the community with pride, and nurture a spirit of cooperation and sportsmanship. The band comprises of students representing a variety of disciplines who contribute musically to the game-day atmosphere uniting the study body, university, and community in mutual camaraderie.

## **Student Expectations:**

Members of the FAU 'Parliament Sound' Pep Band are expected to attend all rehearsals and games presented on this syllabus for the semester. Perfect attendance is considered the norm. In the event of illness or emergency, email the instructor within one-day of the absence requesting that it be excused. Failure to do so will result in an unexcused absence.

**Attendance**: taken 30-minutes before a game begins.

## Uniform:

All members of the FAU 'Parliament Sound' Pep Band will purchase a red uniform polo. The red polo along with a pair of blue jeans is the bands official uniform. Polo's will be available for sale throughout the semester. Nothing is to be added to the uniform without permission of the instructor.

#### General Rules:

- Cheer for our team, never against the other team
- Get concessions or use the restroom in groups no larger than two at a time during the game. There will be a larger break at half-time.
- The use of alcohol, drugs, smoking, or vaping, will not be tolerated at any rehearsal, performance, or road trip. They are grounds for immediate dismissal from the ensemble.
- There will be no hazing of any member of the 'Parliament Sound'. Further, there are no official gatherings of the 'Parliament Sound' on or off campus, except otherwise listed in the course syllabus.
- All members of the band will show the upmost respect to their colleagues and university equipment
- Be mindful of our appearance in the stands. Most the games this year will be broadcast or webcast to large audiences.
- The director of the Parliament Sound reserves the right to determine appropriate consequences for any breach of these rules

**Travel:** The band will travel with the team should they do well enough to make the C-USA and NCAA Tournaments. Members of the Pep Band are expected to make every effort to attend the tournament in order to represent FAU on the road.

Attendance Policy Statement: Students are expected to attend all of their scheduled University classes and to satisfy all academic objectives as outlined by the instructor.
