According the Bureau of Labors Statistics, employment opportunities in sports and entertainment have higher than average growth projections through 2029, and there are no signs of slowing down. According to the AT Kearny research firm, the global sports industry generates between \$480 billion to \$620 billion per year, with over \$30 billion of revenue in the U. S. alone. The median annual wage for entertainment and sports occupations (non-athletes) was \$47,080 in May 2020, which was higher than the median annual wage for all occupations of \$41,950. Occupations include careers in sports broadcasting, sports communication, sports information, ticketing and sales, sports managers, brand ambassadors, event coordination, sports public relations, community center management, sports archivists, and social media specialists. Catalog Description: Minor in Sport Studies

The undergraduate minor in Sport Studies gives students in any major the opportunity to bring together courses from across Arts and Letters to explore various aspects of sports and society that will help strengthen their ability to see sports not just as game, but as a significant aspect of modern society.

This minor is open to all degree-seeking students. The minor will be awarded upon completion of a bachelor's degree. A student who already holds a baccalaureate degree may pursue the minor in conjunction with a second bachelor's degree. All courses taken in the program may be counted toward other general and specific graduation requirements, and courses taken to fulfill other requirements may be applied to this minor.

Requirements for the minor include completion of four courses (12 credits) with a grade C or better and a 2.5 GPA. At least 75 percent of all credits for the minor must be earned from FAU. In addition to the regular curriculum, other courses with significant attention to sport studies may be approved by the program director.
