Students must take at least two language courses beyond the minimum for graduation (for Spanish this would mean two courses beyond SPN 1121) and spend at least one semester or summer term studying abroad. Students are strongly encouraged to take a literature or civilization course in a modern foreign language.

Area Studies Requirement (18 credits)

The area studies requirement directs students to specialize in two geographical regions (Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, or the Middle East) by taking four 3-credit courses in their major area of interest and two 3-credit courses in their minor area of interest. Of the six courses, four must be taken at the 3000 or 4000 level. The six courses must be drawn from at least 3 different disciplines and may include team-taught and interdisciplinary courses. Students may replace their minor area with two theoretical or Global courses from the list. Special Topics Courses in any discipline may be included for credit depending on the international

content of the course (subject to approval by the concentration committee). Students are reminded that they need 45 3000- or 4000-level credits to graduate.
