Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment		
<p>We are requesting two changes both of which are outlined below:</p> <p>Change 1: Currently, students in the Public/Global/Environmental Health Concentration of the B.A. in Health Science degree program have the course "NUR 3183 Food, Nutrition, and Health" as one of the possible electives. We are requesting to remove this course from the list and replace it with the course "PET 3361 Nutrition in Health and Exercise."</p> <p>The requested change would provide the students with all of the content they currently receive and additional content related to how exercise affects public health worldwide. Further, students in any concentration within the Health Science degree would now have access to the requested course since students in the degree have to take 21 elective credits with 15 from their concentration of choice. For example, students in the Behavioral and Mental Health Concentration would have access to the requested course. The requested course would expose these students to the combination of nutrition and exercise both of which have important behavioral components and have been shown to improve mental health. It is also important to state that the course PET 3361 will be taught with multiple sections each semester.</p> <p>Therefore, we believe the course PET 3361 is a better nutrition course for this program and will better serve students throughout the Health Science degree.</p> <p>Change 2: We are also requesting to eliminate both the Geriatrics (Aging Studies) and Pre-Clinical tracks within the B.A. in Health Science degree program. Also submitted is an email chain from both administrators in our college (College of Science) and the registrars office discussing the elimination of these tracks. Importantly, neither of these tracks are currently accepting students as both are on "hiatus." Further, some of the courses in these tracks are no longer offered which makes the tracks not viable.</p>

Bachelor of Arts with Major in Health Science

(Minimum of 120 credits required)

The Bachelor of Arts with major in Health Science degree is designed for students interested in pursuing careers in healthcare-related professions. This degree provides broad-based interdisciplinary training with a core in the basic sciences and requires a concentration in one of the following areas: ~~Geriatrics (Aging Studies), Women's Health, Public/Global/Environmental Health, Science, Behavioral and Mental Health and Pre-Clinical.~~ ~~(Please note: The Pre-Clinical concentration is on hiatus and not accepting students at this time.)~~

The program structure enables students to take relevant coursework in various colleges and departments across FAU to broaden their understanding of factors that both positively and negatively impact the healthcare system, patients and practitioners. In addition, through the Health Science course sequence, students learn how professionals from various fields of practice (medicine, pharmacy, social work, nursing, etc.) interact in a collaborative manner. Students also have access to clinical observation opportunities and other extracurricular activities (lab experiences, internships, research).

Prerequisite Coursework for Transfer Students

Students transferring to Florida Atlantic University must complete both lower-division requirements (including the requirements of the Intellectual Foundations Program) and requirements for the college and major. Lower-division requirements may be completed through the A.A. degree from any Florida public college, university or community college or through equivalent coursework at another regionally accredited institution. Before transferring and to ensure timely progress toward the baccalaureate degree, students must also complete the prerequisite courses for their major as outlined in the [Transition Guides](#).

All courses not approved by the Florida Statewide Course Numbering System that will be used to satisfy requirements will be evaluated individually on the basis of content and will require a catalog course description and a copy of the syllabus for assessment.

Hi Evonne and Demarus,

I hope you are both well! I received the email below regarding the Geriatrics concentration for the BA in Health Science. I would like to ask if a decision could be made about this concentration and the Pre-Clinical concentration, which was placed on hiatus in 2019.

If the program will no longer offer these concentrations, can they be formally terminated through the UUPC? This would require just a program change form and rationale.

If, instead, the plan is to offer these concentrations at a future time, enrollment can be temporarily suspended for up to 9 semesters with a plan to put them back in rotation accepting students by the 10th semester or terminated.

To temporarily suspend enrollment for the Geriatrics concentration and the Pre-Clinical concentration, all that is needed is an email sent to Admissions (Maura and Jessica) and copy Brian Hodge and me. In the request for temporary suspension of enrollment, the following should be included: the effective term for the beginning of enrollment suspension and the effective term for the reactivation of enrollment for each concentration.

We can update Banner, the master code list and the catalog once we receive the suspension of enrollment email. If they will be terminated instead, we will make updates once the terminations go through UUPC/Steering/UFS.
