The Bachelor of Professional Studies (B.P.S.) is a cross-disciplinary degree program designed for working-age adults who have earned an AA, AS or have completed the State of Florida general education requirements, but did not complete their bachelor's degree. This degree is for individuals who have been out of college between two to ten years and for whom completing a degree could lead to advancement or change in their career. The BPS requires completion of 6 core competencies that focus on vital workforce capabilities, knowledge and skills. The degree will require a minimum of 120 credits as well as completion of advanced coursework in the following five professional competency areas followed by a capstone project. # **Curriculum Proposal**

The Bachelor of Professional Studies (BPS) is a cross-disciplinary degree program designed for working-age adults who have earned college credits but did not complete a bachelor's degree. This degree is for individuals who have been out of college between two to ten years and for whom completing a degree could lead to advancement or change in their career. The BPS requires completion of 6 core competencies that focus on vital workforce capabilities, knowledge and skills. Returning students pursuing a Bachelor of Professional Studies will have the flexibility to take courses across colleges at FAU as well as in various formats including in-person day, evening or online courses. The BPS will be administered from the Davie campus, however, students can register for courses on any FAU campus that offers the required or elective course (including online). Students pursuing the Bachelor of Professional Studies are not permitted to concurrently earn a B.A. or B.S. degree.

### **Entry Requirements\*\*:**

- Completion of an AA, AS or completion of the State of Florida general education requirements.
- Program entry is for returning students who have not maintained continuous enrollment, as defined by university policy, at a state college and/or university.
- Minimum 2.0 overall GPA.
- Foreign Language Entrance Requirement 2 years of same foreign language in high school. \*

  \* If Foreign Language Entrance Requirement was not achieved in high school, students must complete Foreign Language Graduation Requirement (2<sup>nd</sup> Semester proficiency at the college level)
  - \*\*Exceptions will be considered by petition on a case by case basis.

### **Degree Requirements:**

- A minimum of 120 credits overall
- A minimum of a 2.0 FAU GPA
- A minimum of 30 upper division credits must be earned at FAU
- A minimum of 45 upper division credits (3000-4000 level or higher)
- Foreign Language Entrance Requirement
- Civic Literacy Requirement (only required if entering the Florida College/University public university system on or after Fall 2018)
- Summer hour requirement (only required if admitted to FAU with less than 60 transfer credits)
- Gordon Rule Communication and Computation Skill Requirement. Must earn a "C" or better.
- General Education requirements (Intellectual Foundations Program or AA degree from Florida public institution)
- Core Competencies (18 credits). Must earn a "C" or better.
