Undergraduate Certificate in Social Justice and Anti-Oppressive Social Work Practice

An undergraduate certificate in Social Justice and Anti-Oppressive Social Work Practice will prepare students to address current issues of social justice and injustice through the process of anti-oppressive inclusive practice and policy advocacy change within our larger societal systems. The certificate:

1. Prepares students for evidence-based practice in assessing and addressing issues related to social justice and oppression through community development, advocacy, policy formation, and other social work strategies.
2. Provides students with community-engaged learning and reflective practice with regard to social justice and anti-oppression inclusive-practice methods.

Program Requirements:

Students enrolled in the Bachelor of Social Work degree program at FAU may earn the undergraduate certificate by completing the following course requirements:

- SOW 3232: Social Welfare Policy (3 credits)
- SOW 4343: Practice with Communities and Organizations (3 credits)
- SOW 4346: Anti-Oppressive Inclusive Social Work Practice (3 credits)
- SOW 4212: Social Justice and Social Work: Current Issues and Responses (3 credits, including the capstone project)
