<p><b>Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment.</b></p> <p>To meet growing student interest in the Ethics, Law, and Society (ELS) Certificate and to reflect new/updated course offerings in the college, we are proposing two broad changes to the curriculum:</p> <p>1) Currently, students must complete one "Required" course: PHI 4661 Ethical Theory, which is typically offered once a year and is capped at 30 students. To provide students with another means of fulfilling this requirement, we would like to re-label it as a "General Ethics" requirement and allow students to take either PHI 4661 or PHI 3638 Moral Problems. We would also like to remove the option for CCJ majors to substitute CCJ 4054: Ethics and the Justice System and instead move this course to the list of more specialized electives found in the "Course in a third discipline" requirement.</p> <p>2) To each of the remaining three categories ("Philosophy," "Political Science," and "Course in a third discipline"), we have added relevant courses as further detailed in the separate, attached memo.</p>
