Students learn how social structural factors determine the extent of poverty in a society, variation in the character of poverty across space and time, and the uneven extent to which specific social groups experience poverty (e.g., women, children, racial and ethnic minorities). This is a research intensive course (RI) that requires students to complete an original research project on poverty and give a formal presentation of their work to the class.
