## **Course Description:**

This intermediate course utilizes digital cameras, computer software, scanners and printers to articulate personal artistic vision. Visual literacy is expanded on through the study of historic and contemporary photographic images, critiques, projects, field trips and lectures. Access to a digital camera with manual exposure capabilities is required.

### **Course Objectives:**

- Continue development of technical skills for both capturing and processing digital photographic images
- Enhance knowledge of conceptual and aesthetic skills for photography
- Build experience developing a high quality body of work for both digital and printed output
- Learn how to write critically about personal work and the work of others

#### **Learning Methods:**

Formal demonstrations, required readings, lectures, research projects, class discussions, photographic assignments in and out of class, and critiques.

### **Attendance and Class Assignment Policy:**

Attendance is required, and students not present when roll is called at the beginning of class will be marked absent. It is the responsibility of late students to report to the instructor at the end of that class to have the "absence" changed to a "late" on the roll. Excessive absences and tardiness will result in a deduction from your participation/final grade. Special exceptions, including religious observances and other exceptions that are officially recognized by the University, must be discussed and accommodated *in advance* on an individual basis with the instructor. Only properly documented University-approved activities, cases of documented illness, and observance of religious holidays will constitute excused absences. In the event of any absence, you are responsible for all material covered during the missed class period and any assignments that are given during your absence.

Assignments are due at the beginning of class. If your assignment is not prepared, you are still required to be at the group critique. Failing to be present on a due date will hurt both your project grade and your participation grade. Late assignments are penalized, and will not be accepted after two classes have passed. (The Final Project will not be accepted late.) If you miss the critique due to a documented University approved event, you must discuss this with the instructor prior to the due date. Late submissions due to a documented illness will be accepted without penalty within one week of the due date, unless extenuated circumstances warrant additional time.

### **Computer Lab/Classroom Etiquette:**

Cell phones must be turned off (or set to vibrate) and put away at all times during class. Absolutely no cell phone usages will be permitted during class. Computers used in the lab are for working on class projects, not checking personal Facebook pages, email, etc. **Work must be stored on external hard drives.** Lab computers hard drives will be wiped each week.

Critiques are opportunities to share and reflect upon works of art created in this class. It is the responsibility of each member of this class to respect the personal expression of self that goes along with the art making process, affording one another respect during group critiques. A portion of your participation grade will reflect the degree to which you participate in the group critiques.
