III. NEW BUSINESS

1. College of Arts and Letters

Theatre and Dance

Guest Kathryn Johnston presented a new concentration in the B.F.A. program in Theatre. The new concentration necessitated changes in four Theatre courses. Four 2000-level courses will now be moved to the 3000 level. **The UUPC approved the new concentration and the four course changes.**

Communication and Multimedia Studies

AL Rep Julieann Ulin discussed the two new courses and one course change from this department. The prefix change from FIL to DIG reflects the evolving nature of the multimedia genre with "Games" added to the course title and description. **The new courses and course change were approved by the UUPC.**

English

AL Rep Ulin continued with discussion of a new honors course that will serve as a WAC and Intellectual Foundations Program (General Education) course. This course was approved by all the necessary subcommittees. **The UUPC approved the new course.**

2. College for Design and Social Inquiry *Architecture*

Guest Dr. Francis Lyn (remote by phone) discussed the changes in the B.Arch program, which involve realigning the catalog to ensure the total number of credits required for this program matches total credits approved (159) and being required in practice. He said that over the years, the number of credits seemed to increase by 3 due to various adjustments made to the program in the catalog. Nevertheless, with this proposed change, the total for the five-year program will now align properly with the actual number needed by students to graduate. **The UUPC approved the catalog revision**.

Criminology and Criminal Justice

DSI Rep John Renne presented two new courses from this department. There was discussion about the Crime Mapping course; EG Rep Dan Meeroff asked if Geosciences was asked to look at the new course. Rep Renne replied that Criminology asked for a review, but a response was not received to date. The UUPC approved the Crime Mapping course pending support documentation from Geosciences with a deadline of April 5. Following the meeting, Criminology and Criminal Justice representatives requested that the course be tabled as discussions with Geosciences would take more time. **The UUPC approved the other new course.**

Changes in the combined B.A./M.S. program in Criminology and Criminal Justice were discussed by DSI Rep Renne. The changes include a new program description and additional undergraduate admission requirements. **There being no objection, the UUPC approved the changes.** After UUPC approval, the University Graduate Programs Committee will consider the changes at its next meeting.

Social Work

Guest Heather Thompson discussed changes in the School of Social Work. They are twofold: slight catalog changes in the coursework requirements for the bachelor's program and a title change for a certificate. The coursework change involves eliminating a requirement for a specific statistics course. For the certificate in Aging, the title will now be Healthy Aging, reflecting the idea of not just aging, but aging using techniques to improve health and well-being. **The UUPC approved both changes.**

portion to Cuba a corequisite to the main course could be problematic in several respects. The Committee asked for more clarification on this course. **The UUPC tabled both courses.**

A new course on Don Quijote was presented. There being no objection, the new course was approved by the UUPC.
